TSLA, GOOGL, TCEHY, GNRC, SPLK In FFND ETF

David Kalis, Portfolio Manager for The Future Fund Active ETF, told Oliver Renick at TDA Network that the Fund invests in companies with three- to five-year runways that they believe are positioned to capitalize on megatrends, like Tesla & Generac and grow revenues 10-40%, with increasing Total Addressable Markets (TAM) and increasing margins. (TSLA 9.01%, GNRC 3.10% of the portfolio as of 11/15/21)
